# Focus on the Readings...

Today's Gospel alerts the disciples to that time when Jesus will no longer be with them. His departure will be a severe challenge to their faith, and Jesus gives voice to the challenge: 'If you love me you will keep my commandments.' This challenging call to follow the commandments of Jesus is accompanied by a gift—the gift of someone else, the advocate, who will be by their side during that interim period between the two comings. The Holy Spirit is not a thing apart from God and Jesus but the bond of love between them, and the believer is drawn into this love and becomes a part of it through living the way of Christ.
