God has imprisoned all men in their own disobedience only to show mercy to all mankind.

My daughter is tormented by a devil.' But he answered her not a word. And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants,' they said 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his feet. 'Lord,' she said 'help me.' He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs.' She retorted, 'Ah ves, sir; but even house-dogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table.' Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted.' And from that moment her daughter was well again.

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A – 15th / 16th August, 2020



In this gospel, we find another example of the common device used by Matthew to denote the movement of Christianity from a Jewish to a Gentile setting. Jesus has left the Jewish region around the Sea of Galilee and travelled north-west to the Gentile territory of what was ancient Phoenicia in Syria. Jesus' fame has obviously spread even here, but the focus of the passage is not the cure but the dialogue. The woman knows full well that Jesus is Jewish as she hails him as 'Son of David'. His silence in the face of her plea is explained in the next verse—he did not want to exceed his divine mission, which he saw as gathering all Israel into the kingdom. Jesus' response is harsh, but the woman is quick to seize on his imagery and twist it to her advantage, but with humility. She forces Jesus to confront a truth—God's salvation is available to all. He responds generously with both his praise and his healing power.

FEAST OF OUR LADY OF

THE ASSUMPTION: During the Church's liturgical year, there are a number of feast days celebrated in honour of Mary. One of these feast days has particular significance for us as we celebrate our patronal Feast Day this weekend. The dogma of Our Lady's assumption into heaven was promulgated by Pius XII in 1950s and is an expression of belief that Mary, because of her faith and holiness and motherhood of Jesus, has already been admitted in her full personhood (body and soul) into the full and eternal vision of God – a state which for the rest of saved humanity will come at a later time. We say at the Creed every Sunday, I look forward to the resurrection of the dead. Put simply this is what is at the heart of the doctrine of the Assumption, asserting that the hopes of our faith have already been fulfilled in Mary. Mary is the model and pioneer of faith. This doctrine is not contained in Scripture and cannot be "proved". It is a matter of faith and was part of the Church's traditional faith long before the dogma was proclaimed.
