A reading from the prophet Jeremiah 38:4-6. 8-10

The king's leading men spoke to the king. 'Let Jeremiah be put to death: he is unquestionably disheartening the remaining soldiers in the city, and all the people too, by talking like this. The fellow does not have the welfare of this people at heart so much as its ruin.' 'He is in your hands as you know,' King Zedekiah answered 'for the king is powerless against you.' So they took Jeremiah and threw him into the well of Prince Malchiah in the Court of the Guard. letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the well, only mud, and into the mud Jeremiah sank. Ebed-melech came out from the palace and spoke to the king. 'My lord king,' he said, 'these men have done a wicked thing by treating the prophet Jeremiah like this: they have thrown him into the well where he will die.' At this the king gave Ebed-melech the Cushite the following order: 'Take three men with you from here and pull the prophet Jeremiah out of the well before he dies.

of the joy which was still in the future, he endured the cross, disregarding the shamefulness of it, and from now on has taken his place at the right of God's throne. Think of the way he stood such opposition from sinners and then you will not give up for want of courage. In the fight against sin, you have not yet had to keep fighting to the point of death.

TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C - 13th / 14th AUGUST, 2022



In a rather confronting Gospel passage this week, we hear how Jesus' message of peace will not always find receptive hearts. The increasing hostility to his message that he encounters will come to a climax as he approaches Jerusalem, the city of destiny. This leads him to see himself as a person who provokes prophetic hostility rather than peace. It seems best to understand the 'fire' that Jesus says he has come to bring to the earth as the gift of the Holy Spirit. John the Baptist had prophesied that the coming One would baptise 'with the Holy Spirit and fire' (Luke 3:16). And indeed at Pentecost the gathered disciples will receive the Spirit in the visible form of 'tongues as if of fire' (Acts 2:3). But the Spirit cannot be given until Jesus has faced and gone through the destiny that awaits him in Jerusalem.
